Daylight Division's Summer Meet To Be Held In Fresno August 24th 4 Layouts Open For Tours Plus Two Model Railroad Shops

The summer meet of the Daylight Division will be held in Fresno, August 24th. The meet will be held at Marlin Costello's home, located at 1125 East Holland Ave. in Fresno (see map). Marlin's home layout, the "Goshen Goose Chase, will be up and running for the meet. The layout, a free-lanced layout, is under Digitraxx's DCC control and is currently under construction, though operational. Marlin used a modified steel bench work, based on the nuclear blast proof bench work made world famous form the folks on the coast side of the division.

The meet starts promptly at 10:00 AM with registration and contest entries (DON'T FORGET TO BRING YOUR FAVORITE MODELS, PHOTOS, OR MODELS TO BE JUDGED!!!!). Marlin will be giving a seminar on how he modified his bench work to fit his needs. After the seminar and contest judging, we'll have the business meeting and immediately following the adjournment of the meeting, we will be having the world-famous White Elephant Auction, so don't forget to bring any brownpaper or newspaper wrapped items for the Auction.

After the closing of the Auction, time will be allowed for lunch, then it's time for an operation session on Mel Norwood's home layout, the "Grand Canyon and Central Arizona Lines". Mel's layout is now fully Digitraxx DCC'ed. He has 8 throttles for those wishing to operate on the layout, but if you have your own Digitraxx throttle, please bring it along. Mel has a new addition to the layout—the Santa Fe's line into El Paso. Mel's layout is a 14' X 40' HO scale that depicts the Santa Fe mainline running from needles, California, to Williams, Arizona, during the steam to diesel transition era. It also includes the branch line running to the Grand Canyon. All this while being serenaded by a thunder and lightening storm over the Grand Canyon and the Grand Canyon Suite!

After the operation session on Mel's layout, there are two other layouts on tour. The Fresno Model Railroad Club's Manchester Mall layout, in both HO and N scale, is a real crowd pleaser and is located in the Manchester Mall, which is located at the northeast corner of Shields and Blackstone, in Fresno.

The other layout, Jim Neil's Santa Fe Los Angeles and Mojave divisions is one of the best looking layouts depicting the Tehachapi Loop area. Although not fully finished with the scenery yet, Neil has been plugging along on the scenery, and this layout makes you feel like you're right at "The Loop" watching those trains!

Fresno is also home to two model train shops. The first, Tom's Trains, is a quaint train shop that is located in Fresno's Tower District, with it's many restaurants. The shop is located a t1476 North Van Ness Ave.

The other shop is logically named Fresno Model Railroad Shop, located at 744 "P" Street, and the shop is a stone's throw from the Amtrak Station.

To get to Marlin Costello's home from the south of Fresno off of Highway 99:

- Take the CA-41 N exit towards YOSEMITE. And merge onto CA-41 N and travel 5.13 miles
- Take the ASHLAN AVE exit
- Turn LEFT onto E ASHLAN AVE and travel

Museum Highlights:

Outdoor displays of rolling stock, locomotives, general railroad operating equipment such as the Santa Fe FP-45, ATSF Caboose, UP Caboose, ATSF Horse car, a 44-ton locomotive, Gas powered speeder, Manual powered hand car, etc. WARM is located in an authentic railroad depot with indoor displays such as Hank Graham's award winning models, railroad china, the largest date nail collection, etc. Also on display is the Dogtooth Mountain RR, an operating HO layout with superb detail. This layout was featured in the April 2002 issue of Model Railroading magazine. In addition the Route 66 museum and Harvey House is located within the property.

0.75 miles

• Turn RIGHT onto N COLLEGE AVE and travel 0.25 miles 14: Turn RIGHT onto E HOLLAND AVE. and travel .02 miles and Marlin House will be on your right.

If you are traveling to Fresno from the North on Highway 99, use the following directions:

- Take the exit towards GRANTLAND AVENUE. And travel .25 miles
- Turn LEFT onto W HERNDON AVE. and travel 7.44 miles
- Take the CA-41 S ramp. and merge onto CA-41 S. and travel 2.59 miles
- Take the ASHLAN AVE exit. And turn RIGHT onto E ASHLAN AVE. and travel .63 miles
- Turn RIGHT onto N COLLEGE AVE. and travel .25 miles
- Turn RIGHT onto E HOLLAND AVE. and travel .02 miles and Marlin house




